Qualifications

- Have a personal, growing relationship with Jesus Christ (preferably for two years or more)
- Recognize the Bible as the authority for their lives
- Currently in a Community Group experience (preferably)
- Be faithful, available and teachable in learning from their Group Leader and the Groups staff.

Expectations

- Learn how to lead a group through conversations with your group leader and by facilitating the various components of the group meeting and group dynamics.
- Participate in group leadership development opportunities provided by the church
- For Married Community Groups, both husband and wife actively participate in all group leadership activities
